Pursuant to the provisions of Rule 11(c) of the Rules of this Court, Petitioner respectfully requests leave to cite material in the record before the administrative agency in this case that has not been reproduced in the Joint Appendix.

The grounds for this motion are as follows:

- 1. One of the grounds on which petitioner seeks review in this case is that the agency did not have substantial evidence to support its decision. Reproduction of the extensive portions of the administrative record necessary for the review of petitioner's claim that the agency did not have substantial evidence to support its ruling would have caused a financial hardship on the petitioner.

Wherefore, the petitioner respectfully requests that this Court refer to material in the record before the administrative agency that is not reproduced in the Joint Appendix in this case.
