## Is ecstasy a gain or drain to brain?

HE MYSTERY surrounding "ecstasy" — the controversial designer drug fore users claim incredible persal losight and whose detracts fear horrible brain damage may be solved by ploneering search under way in Santalara County.

The nation's first ecstary reerch on monkeys and people is sing conducted in laboratories; the Institute for Medical Reerch in San Jose and at Stanrd University, in hopes of deterdning exactly what the substance does or doesn't do to the brain.

The initial research on monkeys shows heavy losses of a type of brain signal transmitter and signs of potential brain damage. But the work on the humans — 23 heavy users who have been flown to San Jose from throughout the country for examination — remains confidential until a medical journal reviews the research.

Ecstasy, a hybrid drug between a hallucinogen and an amphetardine, is also known as MDMA or Adam.

The drug, first made by a German company in 1914 as a possible appetite suppressant, is popu-

lar on college campuses and among young professionals despite a federal ban on the substance. At Stanford, for example, a recent survey indicated that perhaps 39 percent of the undergraduates had tried the drug.

Many psychiatrists and theraplats awear by ecatasy's ability to induce in their patients a peaceful discovery of personal insights, accomplishments that therapy without drugs sometimes can't achieve. They are convinced that a small number of mild doses is safe

Some users have reported physical side effects: tense jawa, clenched teeth, accelerated heartbest and fatigue.

But sorting out and explaining these effects with solid science has been difficult, researchers and psychiatrists say.

The glant pharmacy companies, they say, don't want to touch ecstasy because the profit potential died when its patent did in the 1920s. No company has conducted any research on the substance in recent years, leaving that to a handful of university scientists.

But the biggest roudblock is the tight federal restrictions on the substance.

Ever since the federal Drug Enforcement Administration
