Language Plan On Shelf

A movement to make English Florida's official language has been shelved for another two years, but not for lack of support in Sarasota County.

Proponents of the drive for a constitutional amendment have lost their bid to have the question placed on the November general election ballot.

The campaign raised about 200,000 of the 350,000 signatures needed statewide to force a referendum on the subject, although the Sarasota County chapter easily surpassed its goal of collecting 15,000 signatures.

Campaign officials said the signatures will be valid for two years and that the effort to collect more names will begin anew after the current election season ends.

No New Clues In Murder Case

Almost six months after a retired Sarasota newsmen and his wife were found stabbed to death in their home, Sarasota County sheriff's deputies have no new clues.

Information about the killings of Philip H. Harris, 82, and his wife, Genevieve, 72, on Feb. 26, will soon be sent to the Violent Criminal Apprehension Program run by the FBI in Washington, sheriff's detective Lt. Dario Valente said.

"At this point there isn't anything to go on," Valente said. "We had suspects, several suspects, but we have eliminated each one. It's extremely baffling."

The FBI is not expected to solve the cases, but will have them on file to cross-check with similar cases throughout the country.

Judge Rules On MDMA

Psychedelic drug advocate Rick Dobbin of Sarasota has won a victory that could lead to less stringent government regulation of the drug called Ecstasy.

Last year, the federal government banned the mescaline-like drug and put it in the same regulatory category as heroin.

But this May, a federal administrative law judge concluded the drug known to scientists as MDMA has accepted medical uses and does not possess high abuse potential. Therefore, the government should remove the drug from its most strictly controlled category, Judge Francis L. Young said.

He recommended it be placed in a less stringently controlled class of prescription drugs, along with such products as Tylenol with codeine and amphetamine-based diet pills.

Dobbin, a 32-year-old New College student, had organized the pro-Ecstasy researchers and psychologists who initiated the hearing before Young.

However, the matter is not settled. Federal officials said they disagreed with the judge and extended the current ban for another six months, until December.

Conenose

Wanted—Alive

Reports of conenose assassins continued to increase this week in Sarasota County, but a county official is looking for live samples of the insect to dissect.

"We haven't been able to get any live ones. If we got a few live ones, I'd dissect them," said Ray Parsons, the county's director of mosquito control.

Parsons wants to see if the bloodsucking insects carry the microorganism that spreads Chagas Disease, a tropical malady.

Parsons said it's unlikely the dissections will reveal the microorganism, and even less likely the insects would transmit the disease to humans. But he said he wants to check to make sure.

Meanwhile, Parsons said that within two weeks his department hopes to begin surveying more than 50 homeowners who have reported finding the insect. The sightings are centered in southern and eastern portions of Sarasota County, but Parsons said he also has received scattered reports in Manatee and Charlotte counties and in coastal areas of Sarasota County.

Parsons said the county doesn't know what to tell homeowners who spot the insect. Its painful bite is infected easily and can provoke an allergic-type reaction in some of its victims.
